From the Board

The battle with cancer and ultimate death of our minister, Reverend Christine E. Hillman, dominated the discussion at the meetings of our Board in June and August. At our meeting on June 16, Christine was just beginning chemotherapy for her cancer and we were hopeful of her recovery. Helen Moore did discuss the successful arrangement of services by church members to replace those that Christine had planned in May and June, but regular business was also handled. In particular, the Board discussed suggestions from the Visioning Session last November for a change in the Board's structure to a small executive board. While it appreciated the objective of making meetings shorter and more efficient, it was concerned that meetings without the direct participation of trustees who chair the standing committees would have the effect of delaying action and further isolating the Board from congregational input. It would also require a major rewrite of the church's by-laws, and in any case, Board meetings this year have been better at staying on topic and avoiding work that should be concluded in committee. They have thus been shorter, generally less than two hours long, and more effective. It was concluded that instead of changing the board structure, the Board should concentrate on increasing participation in the standing committees and work further on good communication with the congregation.

During the summer, Christine was receiving treatment at hospitals in Michigan. The little news we received was not encouraging: Christine was in pain and did not respond well to the chemotherapy. On Saturday afternoon, July 25, 2015, her husband, Arthur, called to say that Christine wanted Board members of the Church to come to the Beaumont hospital in Royal Oak, Michigan, to meet with her as soon as possible. As communicated to friends and members by email, seven of us drove to Royal Oak and met Christine, Arthur, and Reverend Kimi Riegel, a minister of the NW UU Church in Southfield, who was actively supporting and assisting Christine as part of the UUA's Living Tradition program.

We learned that Christine's condition was worsening rapidly and she had been moved to the care of Hospice. The Board met in a special session on August 4 to discuss plans as well as to approve a private, family service on September 6 to receive the ashes of long-time member Margaret Connelly in our memorial garden. Chaplain Joyse Gilbert officiated.

Rev. Riegel said that Christine had spoken of her love for the church, its people, and her work there. Although Christine could no longer communicate well by phone or email, Rev. Riegel offered to collect messages and stories from church friends and members and read these to Christine. Christine's daughter Courtney had scheduled her wedding to Derrick Lee for later in September but was able to hold it earlier so that Christine could be present. Christine died late on Friday, August 7. Our summer service on Sunday, August 9, was changed to review the development of the church during Christine's 14 years of ministry at Olinda: an impressive legacy! A moving memorial service was led by Rev. Krista Taves at the NW UU Church in Southfield, Michigan, on August 22. Christine's good friend and colleague, Rev. Allison Barrett from Hamilton, will come to Olinda on September 20 to hold a morning memorial service here.

Our next Board meeting is scheduled on Wednesday (!), September 16, 2015, at 7 PM. As always, members are invited to attend.

Summary

Handwriting is a collection of exquisitely crafted poems of delicacy and power - poems about love, landscape, and the sweep of history set in the poet's first home, Sri Lanka. The falling away of culture is juxtaposed with an individual's sense of loss, grief, and remembrance. Handwriting is a poetic achievement by a writer at the height of his creative powers.
