From the Board

The task force received four names of people interested in becoming Olinda's interim minister and they decided to interview three who were the most promising. After intense interviews and many discussions it was decided to advise the U.U.A. of their number one and number two choices. Fortunately our number one choice also choose Olinda as their number one and so more discussions were begun. Rev. Frances Dearman and Olinda have an agreement in principal that she will become our interim minister. There are some details still to be worked out but Rev. Dearman is at the C.U.C. A.G.M. as are Bill and Bobbye Baylis and they have talked. Rev. Dearman is a Canadian citizen living in Victoria B.C. but has extensive experience with many congregations and as an interim minister has lead a number of churches in finding a settled minister. She is well travelled and has spent time in the Toronto area and is familiar with this part of Ontario. The board will need to meet and review the contract and make a decision to accept Rev. Fran as our interim and that will be done a.s.a.p. when Bill and Bobbye return. If all is successful she will begin about Aug. 15th 2016.

At the board meeting it was learned that after many years of service to the church Colette Annetts because of work conflicts will no longer be able to work on the newsletter. The church owes Colette a great deal of thanks for all her efforts and if we could we would give her a great deal of applause . THANK-YOU Colette. 
Olinda Book Club
