From The Board

This has been a very busy and successful week. After two years of planning and working towards a goal, we at Olinda have a settled Minister, Rev. Rodrigo Solano-Quesnel. He was called by a unanimous vote of the congregation on Sunday, April 22, 2018. Rev. Rod, after hearing the news, was quick to accept the call. The search committee has done amazing work. The congregation is very grateful for such a dedicated committee and our future is bright.

We have had two board meetings this month because of the board meeting with Rev. Rod. At the April 12th meeting, the board appointed an ad-hoc committee to explore incorporation. The committee of Laurie Hylton, myself, and Helen Moore, who will take the lead because she has looked at incorporation before, will get information. They have arranged for a congregational meeting to ask the congregation for their support both verbal and financial. A lawyer or paralegal will be necessary to transfer the deed from the trustees to the new corporation and to make sure the Lloyd Fund is protected as well as our charitable status. The motion on which we will vote at the Congregational Meeting on May 13 is: "To proceed with incorporation of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Olinda including transfer of ownership of the church building and ownership of Lloyd Fund from the Board of Trustees to the corporation. Cost of incorporation not to exceed \$4,000."

Thank-You again for so many of the congregation coming out to hear Rev. Rod and so many of the members participating in the vote. It was amazing to hear the spontaneous cheers and response of the congregation to the news that the vote was unanimous. We now look forward to a new minister who we can help move us forward, but we need to do our part to make this church all it can be. And to the search committee, congratulations on a job well done.
