Report from the Board

Change is the essence of life, but some days it seems that we have had more change arriving faster than we really need! Change drives the evolution of our church as you can witness in our Zoom services, website, and newsletters. What drives the change? Well, covid, advancing technology, and climate change have been powerful driving forces! We now use an updated version of our publishing software WordPress for our website and although we have kept up with Newsletter preparation and distribution and recordings of sermons and committee meetings, we have fallen behind in uploading the proper internet links for all the information and must ask for your patience while we learn new tricks and get everything functioning smoothly. We are learning and have already made progress in our video recordings and Sunday services. The video recordings of services are made by the Zoom system in mp4 format and these can be played by most computer systems or transformed into YouTube videos.

The church suffered an interruption in its telephone messaging last month, but I believe this has now been fixed. The telephone system is part of our Rogers internet service and is fed into the telephone in the minister's office on the second floor. The connection to the telephone in the dining room was made by a cable that exited next to the secondfloor window in the printer room, traveled outside for some distance and finally joining old Bell wiring and entering the dining room at a southside window. The minister's phone still worked, but the connection to the dining room failed. I have discussed with the Property committee putting in a new connecting cable that stays entirely inside the building for the connection between floors, but in the meantime, we are again receiving and recording telephone messages.

In communications among "Leaders" in the CUC, it is a pleasure to see our humble church mentioned and part of its mission statement frequently quoted: "This church was founded on the faith the Love is a more positive force for good than fear." It is certainly relevant in these troubled times. Our church is run largely by volunteers, and we thank those who have applied for police clearances that our insurer needs to document the safety of children and seniors in our care as well as Vice-President Michael Hoffman for his valuable guidance.

We all enjoy meeting and singing with other members at church services and discussing local and world events. However, please monitor covid cases and exercise caution. Extra face masks are available on the front table in the church if you need them. Protect yourselves with the new Covid and flu shots as appropriate. As we begin our search for a new minister, your health is vital for the health of the Church!

Keep well and stay safe, and enjoy the changes around us!

Adult Religious Education



Lay Chaplaincy

Have You Ever Thought Of Becoming a Lay Chaplain?



Our UU Church is looking for a lay chaplain to perform and officiate rites of passage (weddings, funerals, memorial services, child dedication services and others) for the general public and in congregations without ministers, for members of the congregation, following guidelines issued by the CUC and additional policies established by each congregation's Board of Directors.

Lay chaplaincy is an important outreach program of the congregation, and the lay chaplains represent their congregation in the wider community. They are expected to perform rites of passage in a manner that celebrates and dignifies those special occasions in human life, adding spiritual depth to the lives of individuals and communities. Lay chaplains are at all times expected to interact with the larger community in a professional manner, and to understand and be able to articulate and model Unitarian Universalist principles and practice.

Lay chaplains are appointed by their congregation for a term for up to 6 years; they report to Olinda Board of Directors and enter into a contract that is annually reviewed with the congregation.
