Report from the Board

The report from the Board this month marks the official yearly transition, where we thank the Board of 2024 for keeping our church running well in the face of multiple physical and fiscal challenges and welcome the new Board of 2025, wishing them well in their efforts to keep us prospering for another season! The physical challenges included the water leaks into the coffee area that required new roofing and the replacement—under warranty—of several deficient solar panels, as well as the installation of a new fibre-optic cable for our internet, wifi, and telephone connections. Now that the new system has been successfully tested, posted on our website, and we have had the opportunity to try the new system and note its new telephone number (548) 324-4352, the older phone connection with Rogers can be discontinued.

The recent cold, snowy and icy weather has been another physical challenge. After having just experienced the warmest year of global temperatures on record, we were generally not happy to experience the lesson that higher temperatures cause the evaporation of more water vapour that can fall as snow and ice as temperatures cool down! Conditions in the midwest were extreme last week and caused whiteout snow and power outages.

We have survived some of the fiscal challenges partly because we volunteer to do much of the work, whether that is sweeping snow, washing dishes, or singing in the choir: we recognize that if we don't take on some chores they might well not get done! (And of course singing together is great fun—not a chore at all!) Perhaps it helps that we are a small rural congregation whose members traditionally have helped each other, but it's an attitude worth preserving as we seek to grow in size. We look forward to the arrival of Spring on March 20 and the increasing daylight hours that we adapt to by switching to daylight savings time on March 9.

Our fiscal challenges include covering operating expenses while facing significant inflation without a full-time minister to attract and engage a generous congregation, not to mention the threat of sizable tariffs from Canada's major trading partner to the South. Fortunately, there is good news on this front. After a couple of years with little success, our ministerial search committee has now found a promising candidate for our position of a 2-year contract minister, and he is scheduled to visit us at the end of March, as described in Toni Janik's column in this newsletter.

Please remember and join us in several events, starting with the memorial service on Saturday, March 1, at 11 am for Eunice and Emil Buhne, organized by their son Neil and given by Rev. Conrad Dippel. There's another virtual Tea with Rev. Jim at 10 am on March 4, our Annual Congregational Meeting starts around 11:40 on March 9, and our annual AUUction from March 31 to April 5. It's great FUNdraiser for us. See the descriptions on pp. 6-9.

Confrontations with Tigers

I recently read this story with a moral for us. I hope you find it as helpful as I have.

One night at a circus the tent was packed with thousands of people. It was time for the tiger trainer to come out and perform. He bowed to the audience then went inside the cage. A hush drifted over the audience as the door was locked behind him. The trainer skillfully put the tigers through their paces. Suddenly there was a huge pop, followed by a complete blackout of power. For several long minutes the trainer was trapped in the cage with the tigers in total darkness. The trainer knew the tigers could see him with their powerful vision, but he could not see them. All he had was a whip and small chair as a means of protection.

Finally, the lights came back on, and the trainer finished his performance. Everyone was amazed that he wasn't attacked and feared for him in the darkness. After his performance the trainer was interviewed by a local television reporter. He admitted how scared he was. But during the blackout he realized that the tigers did not know that he could not see them. He just kept cracking his whip and talked to them until the lights came back on.

There are times when all of us are confronted with tigers in the dark and we lose trust. We don't trust the government. Some don't trust the Church. We lose trust in relationships, in spouses, even our children.

The lights have gone out seemingly in our world. The time to keep attention on the darkness is our task at hand. How do we keep cracking the whip?

When the lights go out and darkness prevails, trust that the love and the Universe has got the tigers under control.

Search Committee

After interviewing many candidates, we have selected one who we believe will be a great fit for our ministry needs here at Olinda. This individual is considering the board's offer of a two year contract with the option in two years to enter into either a renewal of the contract or a call to be our settled minister at the mutual decision of the congregation and the minister.

This candidate would like to meet and get to know our leadership team in small group meetings over the last weekend in March and have an opportunity for the congregation to drop in to meet them at the church. He will also be preaching the service on Sunday March 30th at 10:30 AM with an opportunity for a 30 minute Q & A session after the service and a potluck lunch with the congregation.

The drop-in time will be Saturday, March 29, from 10 AM to Noon at the Church. Please take advantage of this chance to meet the candidate.

While the candidate is here, he will also be getting to know our area, looking at potential places to live and becoming familiar with our congregation.

Note: Unlike the process of a settled ministerial contract, there is no vote by the congregation. The contract is between the Board of Directors and the minister.
